## K-3 Art Guidelines

Accepted forms include painting, drawing, ceramics, sculpture, collage, and mixed media. 2D works must be mounted on sturdy material and 3D works must be stable to stand alone.

## FILM & PHOTOGRAPHY

Photos must be printed and mounted.

Accepted video forms included narrative, documentary, and experimental. Videos must be 5 minutes or less and no larger than 1GB. Acceptable formats include .mov, .m4v, mp4, and all submissions must be on a CD or USB drive.

Accepted forms of fiction and non-fiction include: poetry, short stories, myths, reflective essays, screenplays and comics. Entries may be written in any language if an English translation is provided. Writing must be fewer than 2,000 words. Entries may be handwritten or typed.

## MUSIC

Musical compositions related to the theme must be recorded and entered on a CD or USB drive. Accepted formats include .mp4 and .mp3 and must not exceed five minutes in length or 2MB in file size.

4th Grade Projects are not eligible for the district and statewide competitions but can receive in school awards. With this in mind, completing the Utah Science and Engineering entry form familiarizes 4th graders with the standards and gives them a higher chance of success at the district and state level next year!

All projects need to meet Utah Science and Engineering Fair Standards found on the entry form. Categories are listed on the form and so are areas for a teacher to sign that your project has been approved. An easy time to complete this form and get support is in the after school workshops.
